Make Sure Every Child has a GAL

Starting July 1, 2024, the court must appoint a Guardian ad Litem for every child. 1

• What can you do if a child doesn't have a GAL?

Advise the court that the child does not have a GAL.

Make Sure Every Child Entitled to an Appointed Attorney Has One

If a child meets at least one these criteria, the court must appoint an attorney ad litem for them:

- Live in, or are being considered for placement in, a **nursing home**.
- Are prescribed a psychotropic medication and either don't want to take it or are too young to agree.
- Have a diagnosis of developmental disability.
- Are in, being considered for placement in a residential treatment center (SIPP, therapeutic group home, QRTP, BQRTP)³
- Are victims of human trafficking.

The law requires DCF to request that the court appoint an attorney for children who meet the criteria.4

- What can you do if a child who should have an attorney doesn't have one?
 - 1. If you are in court, and are able to address the judge, you can point out that the child is eligible but doesn't have an attorney ad litem.
 - 2. Contact the DCF-Children's Legal Services Managing Attorney for your region and provide them with the information about the child so they can determine whether they are required to move for appointment of an attorney. (See the back for more information)

Definitions of Guardian ad Litem and Attorney ad Litem

Guardian ad Litem: Fla. Stat §39.01(32) means a person or an entity that is a fiduciary appointed by the court to represent a child in any civil, criminal, or administrative proceeding to which the child is a party, including, but not limited to, under this chapter, which uses a best interest standard for decisionmaking and advocacy.

Attorney ad Litem: Fla. Stat §39.01 (8) an attorney appointed by the court to represent a child in a dependency case who has an attorney-client relationship with the child under the rules regulating The Florida Bar.

Information to Provide to DCF Managing Attorney

If you don't have the child's name provide as much information as you can

Child's Name, approximate age, why you think the child is eligible, Judge's name or judicial division, DCF-CLS attorney, Parent's name, Parent's counsel, Date and Time of the hearing.

Example: I was in Judge Judy's courtroom in Riverside County on Wednesday, May 1st at 10 am when I heard a young teen named Tommy saying that he really does not want to take his ADHD medication. He did not seem to have a lawyer. I don't know his last name, but his case was the third one on the docket.
